## Our Venue

Norden Farm is built on the site of an old Dairy Farm and features two original, listed buildings; a Georgian Farmhouse and an 18th Century Long Barn.



The plan to have an arts centre in Maidenhead had been a long held dream and Maidenhead Arts was set up in 1978 as an umbrella organisation of local arts groups committed to this vision - many schemes later, and with the help of Lottery Funding, Norden Farm Centre for the Arts was built.

The final design stage of the project was completed in late 1998 and Norden Farm Centre for the Arts finally opened its doors to the public in September 2000.
